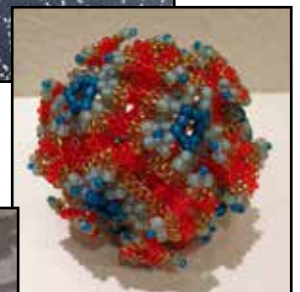


She worked with lei sellers to create large scale nets which concealed military equipment.
