

*Meet Linda Lee - Dinner calabash and Mood
Board Presentation*



Please join us on **Thursday, June 8, 2017** as Linda Lee, renowned national instructor, shows us how to use images from magazines, photographs, artwork, and other mediums as inspiration to create a pieced and collaged jacket using new combinations of colors, textures and patterns. Linda will



show you how to create a mood board as a planning tool for pulling together fabrics and ideas for your own Kabuki Jacket in the June 10 and June 11.

Suggested items to bring to the Mood Board Inspiration meeting should include possibilities for background fabrics. Any weight of fabric in knit or wovens such as linen, cotton, rayon/viscose or wool.

You should also bring any fabrics that you are considering auditioning to use in your jacket. We will be considering a theme for our jackets, for example, you might want an Asian flair, or you may be intrigued with the Southwest, or you may love batiks, you could have a collection of art deco fabrics or hand-dyeds that you have been waiting for just the right project. The options are limitless!

You might also consider bringing fabrics that you would be willing to share with others. Maybe a pile of kimono silks that you have been gathering, or perhaps you have too many pieces of a certain type of fabric, or a nice piece that is simply too large to use all by yourself. *(Additional information on the workshop inside.)*

Above is an example of the jacket. You will be making your own jacket creation using the High Five Jacket pattern provided by Linda Lee. She will email you the pattern prior to the class and you will download the pattern and print on your home printer and tape the pieces together to make a full-size pattern. Alternately, you can send the file to a copy center for full-size printing on large sheets of paper. Bring the printed pattern to the class ready to begin your planning, piecing, and stitching. The piecing for the original Kabuki jacket sample is done using exposed serged seams, but Linda will provide alternate seam finish ideas for those who do not want to use a serger.

mochi sticky rice

By popular request, here's the recipe for the delicious Mochi Rice which was prepared by Lauri Matsushima at our Pillow Challenge potluck. Thank you Laurie, for sharing!

Recipe from Popo's Kitchen Vol. 2 June Kam Tong

STICKY MOCHI RICE

MOCHI RICE MIXTURE:

- 4 c mochi rice
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 Tbsp. hondashi

FILLING MIXTURE:

- 1/2 c. dry baby shrimp (wash and parboil)
- 1 c. cooked lup cheong (diced fine)
- 1 c. black mushrooms (soaked, parboiled, diced fine)
- 1 c. green onions (diced fine)
- 1 Tbsp. oyster sauce
- 1 tsp. fine spice

OIL:

- 3 Tbsp. oil

SOY SAUCE:

- drizzle soy sauce (optional)

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Cook rice in rice cooker according to directions.
2. Heat wok. Add oil. Stir fry filling mixture.
3. Combine rice and filling mixture as soon as rice button shifts to warm. Mix well and let steam for 30 minutes or more.
4. Drizzle soy sauce and mix well.

(I only used lup cheong, black fungus, canned mushrooms and black mushroom for the filling.)
