Share an evening with well known local artist Esther Nowell, as she enlightens us on her use of journals - sketching the people and places she sees throughout her travels. There will be a hands on drawing exercise with Esther - Please bring with you, a wide and finer tip pen, and paper.

Esther was born in Masselon, Ohio in 1920. She moved to Hawaii at an early age and received her education from Ali'iolani Elementary, Roosevelt, and UH Manoa where she graduated in 1968 with a bachelor's degree in Education. Her artistic pursuits began as a student of the Honolulu Academy of Arts Children Classes from grades 3 to 12. She then moved on to the Adult Art School, and later joined the Hawaii Potter's Guild where she remains an active participant. She has been a teacher with the Department of Parks and Recreation since 1966 and was also an active member of HSFAG for many years. Her work is always evolving, be it with clay or fabrics. Her creations have been shown in multiple exhibits and venues including the Hawaii Craftsman and the Gallery at Ward Center. Two of her quilts are in the Hawaii State Foundation of Art Collection. Esther was honored as the 2018 Temari Treasure for her “countless contributions to Hawaii arts ...and a role model to all artists to continue to keep creating.”

In a September, 2018 video interview with Dennis Oda, Star Advertiser photo and video journalist, Esther remarked, “I just want to make things that are pretty and that will make people happy,”.. “that's my philosophy.”
