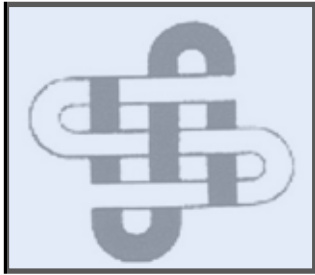

For our September program Sue Larson will show us how to do embroidery with beads. Bead embroidery is a great way to embellish a garment you might be making, or something you already own. Sue will provide a piece of linen material and show you how to compose several stitches. If you wish, you can bring something simple to bead on, maybe a scarf, t-shirt or pocket on a shirt, or???



SUPPLY LIST FOR BEAD EMBROIDERY PROGRAM

Please bring with you to class:

- Small scissors or snips
- Ruler, preferably see-thru
- Disappearing pen
- Personal light if needed
- Glasses, if needed

If you have the following, please bring to class:

- Embroidery needles No 6, 7, 8 and/or 9
 - Variety of embroidery threads, No 25, 12, 8 or 5
 - Seed beads size #8 and #11, you will need approximately 150 beads in order to do all the samples
- If you do not have those items, Sue will have them available for a nominal fee of \$2

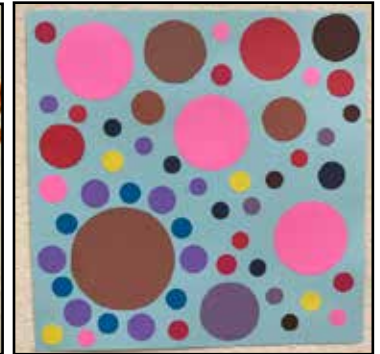

JOY'S CRAB CASSEROLE

Mix:

- 1 can crab
- 1 round onion, chopped
- 1 t. worchestershire sauce
- 1 c. mayonnaise
- 2 eggs
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 1 can chopped water chestnuts

Mix:

- 1 block butter, melted
- 1 c. plain crumbs
- Butter 9X 9 pan
- Put in mixed ingredients
- Sprinkle with buttered crumbs
- Bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes
